Positive Behavior Support

John Wetton Elementary reinforces a school wide system of positive behavior supports that encourage each student to act respectfully, to work responsibly, and to stay safe. Standards-based Assessment

John Wetton uses standards-based grading, which tracks student proficiency toward specific learning goals. This helps students and teachers focus on the specific skills each student needs to master, and provides multiple opportunities for a student to achieve proficiency.
