

EDUCATIONAL OPTIONS FOR GLADSTONE HIGH SCHOOL TAG STUDENTS IN:

Art I

Standard practices provided to all students in this course that address accelerated level and rates of learning:

- Art History research project
- Extra curricular options, including extensions of existing presented problems
- Open ended instruction
- Activities that extend beyond the regular school day
- Opportunities for a forum for student work, including exhibit, juried competitions, Internet galleries, etc.

Coursework in Art 1 accommodates advanced students in art history analysis, writing skills, aesthetics, the production of creative works, and opportunities for display of works in a public forum. The goal for every student is to achieve the highest possible understanding and skill for each area.

- Opportunities for CAM completion in the Arts and Communication CAM Strand
- Through projects and critiques students will practice communication and leadership skills.
- Students will explore art through personal creative expression and through analysis of student and Master works.
- Opportunities for public display of creative works include: Gladstone School District board meetings, Fine Arts Block Open House, Tri Valley League Art Competition, PDX Airport Exhibit, and other shows.
