

EDUCATIONAL OPTIONS FOR GLADSTONE HIGH SCHOOL TAG STUDENTS IN:

Senior Seminar

Standard practices provided to all students in this course that address accelerated level and rates of learning:

- Open-ended instruction
- Develop writing and thinking skills
- Opportunities for critical thinking and writing skills
- Activities that extend beyond the regular school day
- Through projects and critiques, students will practice communication and leadership skills
- Students will explore opportunities and challenges that they will face outside of high school and prepare a plan to accomplish and overcome what will be put before them.

Other options your TAG student may take advantage of in this course that address their accelerated level and rates of learning:

Students that want to challenge themselves can keep daily journals and registers of daily spending within their household. Working together with their household, students can record steps being taken to reduce monthly spending and increase savings through different forms of managing money. This can take place in looking for better cell phone plans, looking at the value of changing utilities, investigating better insurance plans and companies, going online and tracking better prices for groceries as needed.

They can record these efforts in a composition book to then present to the class and explain how and why each of these steps were taken and what the household plans to do with any savings that may have been garnered from the experience.
