The program, staffed by three teachers and Principal Dr. Natalie Osburn, is funded by a \$10,000 grant from Trust Management Services LLC, and a \$1,300 grant from the Gladstone Education Foundation.

Gladstone High School opens new food pantry; coordinator needed

Nationally, one in five families with children 18 and under lives below the poverty line. To help stabilize families so students can succeed in school, Gladstone High School is opening a food pantry.

Starting December 4, the pantry will open Thursdays from 3 to 5 p.m. The pantry is located next door to the Clothes Closet in a portable on the north side of the GHS campus (18800 Portland Avenue). Side road access is available off Nelson Lane.
