Lee was chosen for the honor from a pool of 130 nominees from all the high schools in Oregon. 16 finalists were honored at a banquet on February 25, and Lee was one of four finalists to receive the \$1,500 college scholarship. The middle linebacker was recognized for his excellence in athletics, academics, leadership, and community service.
