School and Community

Gladstone High School is a college preparatory public high school in Gladstone, Oregon, a small town near Portland. The school serves a diverse population of 750 students. The school's numerous college-level courses and the Confucius Classroom Mandarin program draw 25% of our students from 20 neighboring school districts.

A four-year comprehensive high school, GHS is known for its breadth of offerings in college-level and career-technical programs. This year 64 percent of students participate in at least one sport or music program. Many others pursue leadership and club activities.

GPA & Class Rank

Gladstone High School has adopted the A, B, C, D, F grading system based on a 4.0 scale. Permanent records carry trimester grades only, and rank in class and G.P.A. for college admissions are determined at the end of the most recent trimester completed. AP classes and Advanced Senior English have weighted grades, giving students 5 points for an A, 4 points for a B, 3 points for a C, etc.
