Dear Parents and Community Members,

This report from the Oregon Department of Education describes what learning looks like at the Gladstone Center for Children and Families. "Growing Great People" is our goal and we are committed to providing a well-balanced and meaningful curriculum to the district's youngest learners.

The Gladstone kindergarten team works closely with early childhood partners and community agencies to ensure that families are stable and healthy by collaborating on wraparound services that meet community needs. This year, the collaborative will focus on connecting families with nutrition, mental health, and career related services.

Last year our students demonstrated growth in reading, math and social skills. For 2015-2016, we will continue implementation

of "Response to Intervention" which is a system that aims to help struggling learners meet academic goals. Additionally students will receive weekly lessons on social and emotional development, music, movement, and science.

Our goals this year are to increase attendance rates and to partner closely with our families to boost kindergarten readiness skills. Along with our volunteer program and parent meetings, we will host several family nights throughout the school year to increase family participation in school activities.
